- The PNG Forest Authority cannot do this alone we need the support of all forestry stakeholders including landowners, government agencies, civil society groups and the timber industry



3. <u>BACKGROUND ON PLANTATION</u> <u>DEVELOPMENT</u>

- Plantation Development commenced in the 1950's with sporadic progress.
- Currently 50,000 hectares of plantations
- No progress over the years
- Resoucres contraints and lack of direction
- Land security is the main obstacle
- Plantation development and Management Branch inadequately staffed and resourced

5. PAINIM GRAUN (Secure land)

- The PNG Forest Authority's regional and provincial forestry offices are equipped with awareness tools that help landowners to secure land that is suitable for tree planting operations.

6. <u>Planim Diwai (Plant trees)</u>

Operation Painim Graun na Planim Diwai (PGPD) assists tree planting operations on both customary land and state land; working through the PNG Forest Authority's regional and provincial forestry offices.

The PNG Forest Authority will sign community tree planting agreements with successful applicants that have met the program's competitive selection criteria.
