A REAL TOURIST ATTRACTION

Kuriva Teak Plantation Picnic Park is an ideal venue for those wanting to get away from all the hustle and bustle of the busy Port Moresby city life.

LOCATION

It is located about 50 minutes drive out of Port Moresby city along the sealed Hiritano Highway of the Central province, just past Brown River.

Signboard is located on the right side of the road.

SOME UNIQUE FEATURES:

- Crystal cold clear flowing river;
- ◆ A community based market is located at the entrance to the picnic site where you can buy fresh fruits and vegetables;
- Spacious car park with beautiful native flowers and plants;
- ◆ A traditional conference center that can comfortably seat 20 people;
- Nine traditionally built haus wins (resting areas) fitted with seats, arm rests, lights, power points and native orchids;
- Solar light;
- Stand-by 45kva generator set;
- ◆ Canteen providing food & beverages etc., to suit clients needs.
- ◆ Concrete benches for sun bathing and relaxing after swimming
- Water taps for preparing your barbecue meal supported by 2 x 9 liter standby tuffa tanks;
- Large BBQ stands to prepare your big family meal all at once;
- Mumu place for pig and Aigir lovers;
- ◆ Toilet facilities (two each for men/women);
- Rubbish bins provided (Please do not throw rubbish into the river);
- Well kept sports field for the whole family to enjoy;

BRIEF HISTORY ABOUT THE KURIVA FORESTRY PLANTATION

The Kuriva Forest Plantation is one of four plantations in the country that was established in the 1980s through funding from the New Zealand government.

Kuriva plantation has been established on State land (Portion 496). The total plantation area is 8781.68 hectares with 738 hectares planted with the teak tree species so far. The other plantations established under the New Zealand government funding are Ulabo in Milne Bay province, North Coast in Madang and Kaut in New Ireland province.

What is Teak?

Teak, scientifically known as '<u>Tectona grandis</u>' is a **tropical hardwood** tree species that was introduced to Papua New Guinea over 100 years ago. '<u>Tectona grandis</u>' grows into a large tree and has small, fragrant white flowers and papery leaves that are often hairy on the lower surface. Teak wood has a leather-like smell when it is freshly milled. Teak timber is particularly valued for its durability, stability, strength and water resistance. Its attractive appearance makes it one of the world's premiere timbers. Its qualities also include lightness with strength, ease of sawing without splitting, ease of working with and carving. It is used in high quality furniture, boat building and for decorative purposes. It is also used for exterior construction and veneer.

'<u>Tectona grandis'</u> is native to south and southeast Asia, mainly India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Burma, but is naturalized and cultivated in many countries in Africa and the Caribbean. It is sometimes known as the "Burmese Teak" because Burma accounts for nearly one third of the world's total teak production.
